



Town of Caledon Arena Protocols Effective December 20, 2021

General Expectations

- As per the Town of Caledon by-law No. 2020-47, all parties entering a Town of Caledon facility are required to wear face masks/covering that securely covers the nose, mouth and chin prior to entering the facility and continue to wear it at all times while in the building. Face masks/coverings may be removed while eating or drinking only. For more details on the by-law including a list of exemptions please visit www.caledon.ca
- All guests must answer the COVID-19 screening questionnaire through the [Town of Caledon Screening Form \(www.caledon.ca/screen\)](http://www.caledon.ca/screen). The link is also posted on the front door of the facility.
- Proof of vaccination and identification is also required for individuals 12 years and older to enter all Town of Caledon community centres as mandated by the provincial government (some exemptions apply).
- January 4, 2022, enhanced vaccine certificate with QR code will be required as proof of vaccination. Paper vaccination receipts will no longer be acceptable.

- Physical distancing of 2 meters (6 feet) is required at all times while in the facility
- Groups should look to minimize the number of total spectators where possible and communicate accordingly to all participants in advance. Rental groups must abide by the spectator viewing capacities.
- No outside food or drink will be permitted. To ensure masks remain on at all times.
- Warm-ups will not be allowed inside the facility or anywhere off the ice or arena floor surface.
- Water bottles should be filled in advance.
- Parents/ guardians are to maintain physical distance and must enter and exit the facility in the same manner as a participant in the program.
- No loitering in changerooms, lobby or common areas.
- Designated viewing area for parents are as follows:
 - Albion Bolton Community Centre, Don Sheardown Arena- seating areas
 - Caledon East Community Complex Pad 1 – second floor bleacher/seating area
 - Caledon East Community Complex Pad 2 – second floor bleacher/seating area
 - Mayfield Recreation Complex , Garth Young Arena – second floor bleacher/seating and arena lobby viewing area.

- Lloyd Wilson Arena- Limited standing/seating immediately inside the main door (North Lobby)
- Two change rooms will be assigned per rental regardless if it is for a game or practice. Capacity signage will be posted on rooms.

Entering the Facility

- Admission to the facility will commence twenty (20) minutes prior to the start of the rental time. This is to avoid overlap of participants entering and exiting the arena area at the same time. Participants arriving earlier than twenty (20) minutes prior to the start of their program or rental time will be asked to wait outside the facility.
- Participants, coaches, and parents/ guardians are to self screen using the Town of Caledon's self – screening tool (app) www.caledon.ca/screen before entering the facility.
- Participants are encouraged to "Come Prepared" by dressing in their required equipment with minimal change required prior to entering the facility. Skates, helmets, and goalie pads will be put on in changeroom. Hockey bags will be permitted.
- Participants are advised on the changeroom assignment boards, which dressing rooms their groups can use.
- **Masks must be worn at all times in the dressing room by both players, coaches and parent/guardians.**
- Participants under eighteen (18) years of age may have their parent/guardian assist with tying of skates and then the parent/guardian must stay with the child until they are directed to the viewing area by a coach or designate.
- Parents or guardians accompanying a minor into a changeroom do not count towards the capacity.
- Upon being dismissed from the changeroom area the parent/guardian must go immediately to the designated viewing areas within the arena.

- Spectators are always required to maintain social distancing while in the facility.
- If the group size exceeds the capacity of changerooms individuals must wait outside of the changeroom until a spot becomes available and an individual exit to provide the waiting person an opportunity. Goalies should be accommodated by providing first entry
- Showers are permitted if approved by the organization and the group size is small enough to permit time in the changerooms for showering.

Testing positive

- If any athlete, family or staff test positive for COVID-19, the following steps must be taken:
 - Team training and the individual will be suspended immediately.
 - Notify public health and follow recommendations, including further testing and arrangements for contact tracing.
 - Notify the Town of Caledon administration of a confirmed case.
- In the event of a suspected or confirmed case resulting in the cancellation of ice or floor time the Town will apply a credit towards future use and will not apply a cancellation fee.

Failure to adhere to the requirements determined by the Town of Caledon may result in forfeit/cancellation of rental and or potential fines laid out by the Region of Peel.
