



Town of Caledon Arena Protocols

Effective September 28, 2020

General Expectations

- As per the Town of Caledon by-law No. 2020-47, all participants, coaches, and parents/guardians are required to wear face masks/covering that securely covers the nose, mouth and chin prior to entering the facility and continue to wearing it at all times while in the building unless participating on the ice. For more details on the by-law including a list of exemptions please visit www.caledon.ca.
- Physical distancing of 2 meters (6 feet) is required at all times while in the facility and while on the ice. At the current time, the OHF guidelines for hockey still maintain that physical distancing must be maintained at all times both on and off the ice. Current Skate Ontario guidelines stipulate no pairs skating is permitted figure skating rentals.
- Maximum participant numbers on the ice during a session is 30 including coaches and instructors (effective Sept. 28):
- Groups should look to minimize the number of total spectators where possible and communicate accordingly to all participants in advance. This helps ensure the maximum capacity of 50 is adhered to in all arenas. The maximum capacity for Lloyd Wilson Arena is 40 people due to the size of the facility.
- It is strongly encouraged that parents and guardians with players/participants U13 and older do not enter the facility as a spectator unless necessary. They should only pick-up and drop off their player
- To comply with facility capacity regulations, male and female washrooms have been designated at each rink. All users including parents/guardians must use the washrooms in their assigned rinks. Arena users are not permitted to use the washrooms in the lobby.
- Warm-ups will not be allowed inside the facility or anywhere off the ice surface.
- Water bottles should be filled in advance.
- During rentals, only one (1) parent/guardian of each skater under eighteen (18) years of age is permitted in the facility as an observer. Parents/guardians are to maintain physical distancing and must enter and exit the facility in the same manner as players. Designated viewing area for parents are as follows:
 - Albion Bolton Community Centre, Don Sheardown Arena- seating areas

- Caledon East Community Complex Pad 1 – second floor bleacher/seating area
- Caledon East Community Complex Pad 2 – second floor bleacher/seating area
- Mayfield Recreation Complex, Garth Young Arena- second floor bleacher/seating area
- Lloyd Wilson Arena- Limited standing/seating immediately inside the main door (North Lobby)
- Spectators must stay in the designated viewing area while the next rental group enters their changerooms. Spectators will be permitted down to the changeroom area upon the start of the flood.

Entering the Facility

- Albion Bolton Community Centre (Don Sheardown Arena)
 - Enter the main facility doors and follow the directional arrows to the arena entrance, up the ramp and then proceed to designated changerooms.
- Caledon East Community Complex Pad 1
 - Enter through the main lobby door and proceed to pad 1.
- Caledon East Community Complex Pad 2
 - Enter through the east arena vestibule entrance located between Pad 1 & 2 and proceed to pad 2.
- Lloyd Wilson Arena
 - Enter the main facility doors and follow the directional arrows to the assigned changeroom hallway.
- Mayfield Recreation Complex (Garth Young Arena)
 - Enter the main facility doors and follow directional arrows downstairs to the arena changeroom hallway.
- Admission to the facility will commence twenty (20) minutes prior to the start of the rental time. This is to avoid overlap of participants entering and exiting the arena area at the same time. Participants arriving earlier than twenty (20) minutes prior to the start of their rental time will be asked to wait outside of the building.
- Participants, coaches, and parents/guardians are to follow posted self-screening guidelines before entering the Town of Caledon facility.
 1. Do you have any of the following symptoms?
New or worsening cough, difficulty breathing, fever or feeling feverish
 2. Have you had close contact with a confirmed or probably case of COVID-19?
 3. Are you awaiting test results for COVID-19?
 4. Have you travelled outside of Canada in the past 14 days?
 5. Have you been in contact with someone who is ill and who has travelled outside of Canada in the past 14 days?

If you answer Yes to any of the above questions, please do not enter the facility.

- Participants must “Come Prepared” by dressing in their required equipment with minimal change required prior to entering the facility. Skates, helmets, and goalie pads will be put on in changeroom. Hockey bags will be permitted.
- For each session, there are two to three dressing rooms in each arena designated for changing into/out of skates. Participants are advised on the changeroom assignment boards, which dressing rooms their groups can use.
- **Masks must be worn at all times in the dressing room by both players and parent/guardians.**
- Each participant’s seat is marked with an X. Participants under eighteen (18) years of age may have their parent/guardian assist with tying of skates and then the parent/guardian must stay with the child until they are directed to the viewing area.
- Upon being dismissed from the changeroom area the parent/guardian must go immediately to the designated viewing areas within the arena.
- Spectators are required to maintained social distancing using the provided markings in the stands.
- Players/participants must exit the facility as they entered (dressed in their equipment)
- If the group size exceeds the capacity of changerooms individuals must wait outside of the changeroom until a spot becomes available and an individual exit to provide the waiting person an opportunity. Goalies should be accommodated by providing first entry.
- Shower facilities will not be available before or after the skates
- Players/participants are not allowed to undress out of their equipment inside the facility.

Exiting the Facility

- Albion Bolton Community Centre (Don Sheardown Arena)
 - Patrons will exit using the arena facility doors.
- Caledon East Community Complex Pad 1
 - Patrons will exit the facility the same way they entered via the lobby and west entrance.
- Caledon East Community Complex Pad 2
 - Patrons will exit the facility the same way they entered via the east arena vestibule entrance located between Pad 1 & 2.
- Lloyd Wilson Arena
 - Arena patrons will exit the facility through the designated arena exit.
- Mayfield Recreation Complex (Garth Young Arena)
 - Arena patrons will exit the facility through the south arena exit.
- Please proceed out of the facility using the directional markings and proceed to your vehicle.

Testing positive

- If any athlete, family or staff test positive for COVID-19, the following steps must be taken:
 - Team training and the individual will be suspended immediately.
 - All athletes and staff can either be placed in self-isolation for 14 days or get tested to confirm they are negative for COVID-19.
 - Notify public health and follow recommendations, including further testing and arrangements for contact tracing.
 - Notify the Town of Caledon administration of a confirmed case.
- In the event of a suspected or confirmed case resulting in the cancellation of pool time the Town will apply a credit towards future use and will not apply a cancellation fee.
